

AN UNFORGETTABLE EXPERIENCE

One of the first things I learned after arriving at the Marine Corps Air Station, Quantico, VA in August 1961 was that it was home base for HMX-1, the Marine Corps' presidential helicopter squadron. On checking in, I discovered that the hangers for the presidential aircraft were across the street from my barracks, in a highly secure area guarded by armed Marines that only individuals with the highest-level security clearance could freely enter. All others were permitted in the secure area only while on an authorized assignment, under the watchful eye of an armed guard.

I saw the presidential aircraft — nicknamed White Tops for their highly polished dark green body with a white top — from a distance daily, but only had one opportunity to fly in one. The squadron was in the process of issuing new security I.D. badges with color photographs. The photo lab had taken color photos of the majority of squadron

personnel, but still needed to photograph those working at the squadron's facility at the Anacostia Naval Air Station in Washington, DC.

I was thrilled to be assigned to take those photos and, with the crew chief, fly up to Washington, D.C. in one of the presidential helicopters. The flight was unlike any I had experienced before or since. There was no comparison between the spartan, noisy interior of the standard HUS-1 helicopter (later redesignated the UH-34D that saw extensive service in Vietnam). In addition to the sound proof upholstered overhead and bulkheads, the White Top had a carpeted deck and was equipped with the wide comfortable Class section of commercial airliners. I also remember three color-coded telephones, which presumably, when used by the president, connected him with the

White House's worldwide communications network. Best of all was the oversized window adjacent to the president's plush seat that provided spectacular views along the Potomac River and the Washington skyline as we approached the Nation's Capital.

The assignment was brief. I quickly set up a tripod mounted with my camera to take color photos of the HMX crew members working at the Anacostia hanger. After completing my assignment, I boarded another White Top for the return flight to Quantico with a new view as we traveled south. The view included a postcard view of Mt. Vernon

> just a few hundred feet below. I'm still in awe that I sat in President Kennedy and before him, President Eisenhower's seat.

When I arrived at Quantico in August 1961, HMX began months of vigorous flight-testing of three Sikorsky HSS-2 helicopters as a possible successor to the aging

presidential fleet. Known as the Sea King, the HSS -2 had several safety features lacking in the HUS. Originally built as an anti-submarine warfare aircraft, it had a watertight fuselage and pontoons over the two main landing wheels, allowing it to make emergency water landings. The new aircraft's twin G. E. turbine engines, replaced the single engine HUS, giving pilots a backup in the event an engine failure. In April 1962 the first of four new executive aircraft, officially designated the HSS-2Z, arrived at HMX from Sikorsky. Like their predecessors, the new aircraft, were painted a shiny dark green with white tops, and proudly displayed the word MARINES in large, white letters and, unlike its predecessor, had twin turbo engines, a watertight fuselage and pontoons over the main landing wheels, allowing it to make emergency wa-

Scholarship Requirements and Details

The First Marine Aircraft Wing Association, Vietnam Service will award up to five scholarships of \$500 each during Reunion 2022.

To qualify for a scholarship, applicants must meet the following qualifications:

Be a First Marine Aircraft Wing Association, Vietnam Service member in good standing (i.e., dues are paid up to date), their spouse, dependent or direct descendent. Further, the member must have a minimum of one-year membership as of (to be announced).

-OR

Be a spouse, dependent, or direct descendent of a deceased member of the First MAW Assn. VN Service -OR

Be a spouse, dependent, or direct descendent of a Marine or member of another military service, who lost his/her life while serving in Vietnam with the First Marine Aircraft Wing.

-AND

Applicant must be **currently enrolled and attending**, in the accredited college, university, or trade school and be in good academic standing.

Applicant will be required to submit an essay of 300-350 words. The applicant can choose one of the following topics:

- 1. What the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial means to me.
- 2. What all Americans can do to solve the energy crisis.
- 3. How I plan to use my education to aid society.
- 4, Why I support our Marines in harm's way.

To compete for a scholarship, applicants must submit their essay in accordance with the following instructions:

- 1. The essay must be typed. **Do not include applicant's name on the essay page**. Attach a cover page with the applicant's name, address, phone number and email address. The cover page must also include the name of the First MAW Assn. VN Service member and membership number, along with the applicant's relationship to the member (spouse, son, daughter, grandchild etc.).
- 2. Verification from a counselor or other school official confirming that the applicant is enrolled. This letter needs to be on school letterhead.
- 3. A copy of the student transcripts

The essay and required documents must be post marked no later than September 13, 2022.


